

RESTRICTED MEDICATION LIST

1. All medications must be turned in upon admission and dispensed by the staff as prescribed by Doctor.
2. Non prescription medication is restricted to those that are deemed necessary by the Counselling Staff.
3. Psychiatric Drugs
 - a) Drugs used to treat Psychosis
 - Client must be working with a Mental Health Professional
 - The list of drugs permissible but not limited to are:

- b) Drugs used to treat Depression-
 - Client must be working with a Mental Health Professional
 - The list of drugs permissible but not limited to are:

- c) Drugs used to treat Anxiety – Tranquillizers, sleeping pills **ARE NOT PERMITTED** while in Treatment as they are abused and render the client incapable of participating fully in the Treatment Program, ie;

- d) Drugs used to treat Opioid Dependency-
- Client must be working with a Mental Health Professional
 - The list of drugs permissible but not limited to are:

- e) Pain medications **NOT PERMITTED** while in Treatment

Oxycodone (Oxycontin, Percodan)

Non prescription pain meds are not permitted while in Treatment.
Toradol (Ketorolac) is acceptable as it is a non-opioid with good pain relief, non-dependant for clients with documented chronic pain.
 Also, **Naproxen, VIMOVO, Arthrotec** and **Diclofenac** generics are permitted substitutes.
